Sally Hepworth is an Australian novelist who writes brilliant. compelling psychological thrillers with complex, honestly drawn characters. Edge-of-your-seat tension combined with a rich, warm heart, this novel is about the uncompromising bond between twins. Rose and Fern. Raised by an emotionally volatile, single mother they endured an unstable childhood stamped by poverty and ultimately defined by a tragedy that they were involved in. The tragedy was the only time Rose couldn't prevent Fern doing something dreadful.

Since, they have clung to one another. Fern isn't neurotypical - she's on the autistic spectrum and craves routine. Disruption can be difficult for her, so naturally Rose is protective. But Rose has issues of her own; her marriage is threatened as she can't get pregnant. There is so much to become embroiled and involved in. Hepworth shifts between the sisters' points of view, serving upincredible twists and revelations that will have you turning pages at the speed of light. An intelligent, emotional and quirky story rooted in a dark, suspenseful thriller about an ugly truth and secret manipulations. Truly unique, possibly my favourite book this year.
